

# WHITE SPOTS—INACTIVE LESIONS (shiny appearance)



## *Do you have white spots on your teeth that have been there for a long time?*

Healthy, normal tooth enamel should have a smooth, lustrous surface. White spots can form due to the caries process producing enamel demineralization, or can be the result of fluorosis or infectious disease episodes. White spots can also be idiopathic, meaning, no identifiable cause.

## Easy At-Home Application

Leave for at least 3-5 minutes. Expectorate (spit) but do not rinse. Leave the excess to slowly dissolve.

<b>How Often</b>	Twice a day.
<b>When</b>	In the morning and the evening after brushing and flossing
<b>How Long</b>	<b>In-office:</b> Immediately following white spot pre-treatment. <b>At home:</b> 8-10 weeks with recall in about 2-week intervals. <i>Reevaluation</i> by your dental professional in about 2 weeks.
<b>How</b>	Finger application or custom tray application.
<b>Other</b>	Talk to your dental professional for pre-treatment options for inactive lesions, and determine your risk factors for cavities. If possible, reduce acid exposure and maintain a healthy diet.
